Mary H H Ensom

BS(Pharm), Pharm.D., FASHP, FCCP, FCSHP, FCAHS

Dr. Mary H H Ensom is Professor, Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Distinguished University Scholar, University of British Columbia (UBC), and Clinical Pharmacy Specialist, Children's & Women's Health Centre of British Columbia. Early in her career as a hospital pharmacist, she developed clinical services in South Carolina, Washington, and Kentucky (1978-85).

Mary served on the Faculty at the University of Kentucky College of Pharmacy (UKCoP) and as Director of UK Medical Center's Clinical Pharmacokinetics Service for 10 years before joining UBC in 1997 where she was Director of the Graduate PharmD Program for 10 years (2002-12). Aside from teaching thousands of BSc(Pharm) and PharmD students, she has supervised/co-supervised more than 100 hospital pharmacy residents, MSc and PhD students, and postdoctoral fellows.

Mary has >540 publications on clinical pharmacokinetics/pharmacodynamics/ pharmacogenetics to her credit and received >85 awards for scholarship, research, and service, including 11 teaching awards [e.g., 2000 UBC Killam Teaching Prize and 2011 American College of Clinical Pharmacy (ACCP) Education Award]. She is one of only a few dozen Distinguished University Scholars at UBC and received the 2007 UBC Killam Research Prize in Science (one of only 5 campus-wide).

Mary is the only Canada-based recipient of the ACCP Education (2011) and Publication (2006) Awards and the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists Award for Sustained Contributions to the Literature (2012). Mary received the 2013 Paul F. Parker Award from the UK Pharmacy Residency Program "in recognition of an individual who has displayed sustained contribution to the profession in practice, teaching or research; a commitment to high ideals and excellence in their chosen field; leadership and innovation; and a passion to encourage the personal and professional growth of others" and was inducted into UKCoP's Hall of Distinguished Alumni inaugural class (n=4) in 2015.

Mary was Editor for the *Canadian Journal of Hospital Pharmacy* for 10 years and on its Editorial Board from 1997-2016, and is on editorial boards of 5 other journals. She served on CSHP's Research Committee from 1999-2011 (as Chair: 1999-2005). She received the CSHP-BC Distinguished Service Award in 2014.

Mary is a fellow of ASHP, ACCP, and CSHP, and one of only a dozen pharmacists who are fellows of the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences (CAHS).

The Distinguished Service Award is given in recognition of outstanding achievement in hospital pharmacy practice. It is awarded for significant contributions to hospital pharmacy practice and to CSHP at the National and Branch/Chapter levels. Individuals are nominated by their peers.

Theresa Hurley **BSc(Pharm), ACPR**

Theresa graduated from Dalhousie University in 1988 with a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy. She worked at Saint John Regional Hospital for two years before moving to London, ON to complete a Residency in Hospital Pharmacy in 1991. After a brief return to NB community pharmacy practice, she moved to Halifax to work at Camp Hill Medical Centre in 1993. Theresa assumed various clinical roles before joining the Drug Information Centre in 2002. She is currently chairperson of the Nova Scotia Health Authority IV Drug Therapy Subcommittee and the

Provincial Antidote Kit Advisory Committee.

Theresa has been continuously active in the CSHP Nova Scotia Branch since 1993. She has been a member of almost all Branch committees including Awards, Education, Membership and Student Public Relations. She was a member of the planning committee for the CSHP Summer Education Session held in Halifax in 2010.

Theresa served on NS Branch Council for 13 years (2001-14). First as liaison to the Nova Scotia College of Pharmacists for 5 years followed by the presidential offices from 2007-10. She became NS Delegate to the CSHP Board in 2010 and served for 4 years. Theresa has mentored numerous branch members, served as branch historian and revised countless branch documents; the most recent being the Branch Operating Guidelines in 2014. She was awarded the Gail McGlynn-Tuttle Memorial Practitioner Award in 2003 for significant contributions to CSHP and hospital pharmacy practice by the NS Branch.

On a national level, Theresa served on the Risk Management Task Force from 2011-6. She is currently chairperson of the Parenteral Pharmacy Specialty Network (PSN) and is a member of the PSN Coordinating Committee.

Theresa has presented at both national (Professional Practice Conference 2007, Summer Education Session 2012) and branch education events during her career.

She is grateful to CSHP for providing her the opportunity to grow professionally, network with other CSHP members, and for enriching her career.

Theresa is an avid traveler and theatregoer. She lives in Dartmouth with her husband Ian and cat, Digger.

Maria Moreno is a fourth-year PharmD student at the University of Toronto who is honoured to have been selected as this year's recipient of the Hospital Pharmacy Student Award. Maria completed three years of undergraduate studies at the University of Toronto's Faculty of Arts and Science before choosing to pursue a career in Pharmacy. She was drawn to the profession for its evolving landscape and the value that pharmacists bring to patient care.

Maria feels lucky to have been exposed to several areas of the pharmacy profession. She has completed clinical rotations in hospitals in Toronto and Ottawa in the areas of oncology, emergency medicine, general medicine, intensive care, and rehabilitation. Maria also completed a research rotation at the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario conducting a retrospective chart review on the use of cannabis in children. In addition, she has volunteered at the University Health Network working on a variety of projects at Princess Margaret Cancer Centre and the Toronto Western Hospital Family Health Team.

During her time as a student, Maria founded a club called Pharmacy Pediatric Initiative that aims to help students learn about the role that pharmacists play in pediatrics, and empower students to provide care for these types of patients in the future. Maria was also part of CAPSI Council where she represented UofT pharmacy students on a national level. She oversaw the implementation of all CAPSI initiatives at UofT and was the chair of Pharmacist Awareness Month 2017. Through this, she created opportunities for students to be recognized for their professional skills and advocate for the profession.

Maria has also been involved with CSHP as the student representative on the Excellence In Hospital Pharmacy Program Steering Committee. As part of the Communications Working Group, she has been greatly involved in promoting the Excellence program, which assists members in focusing their efforts towards fostering excellence and innovation in patient care.

Outside of pharmacy, Maria's interests include swimming, travelling, and learning about different cultures. Maria is looking forward to becoming a practicing pharmacist and hopes to work in a hospital setting while incorporating research and teaching into her career.

Doson Chua

BScPharm, PharmD, BCPS(AQ)

Dr. Doson Chua is a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist, Cardiology at St. Paul's Hospital in Vancouver. He is also a Clinical Professor in the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences at the University of British Columbia.

Dr. Chua has been involved with CSHP at both the branch and national levels. He is the Past President of the CSHP BC Branch, Member at Large in the CSHP Cardiology Pharmacy Specialty Network (PSN), and a member of the Cardiology PSN Core Committee.

Dr. Chua works in the Cardiac Intensive Care Unit (CICU) at St. Paul's Hospital, a quaternary cardiac referral hospital for the province of BC. He is an integral member of the medical team on daily CICU rounds and routinely deals with patients with a multitude of cardiac diseases (acute coronary syndromes, heart failure, arrhythmias, left ventricular assist devices, and cardiac transplant).

He has published in the areas of anticoagulation, acute coronary syndromes, statin therapy, hospital pharmacy practice, and medication safety.

Dr. Chua is a Clinical Professor in the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences at the University of British Columbia, and he regularly teaches in the pharmacy undergraduate, graduate PharmD, and Entry Level PharmD curriculum. He also teaches in the UBC Canadian Pharmacy Practice Program (CP3) for International Pharmacy Graduates and has taught in the UBC Pharmacy Technician Bridging Program.

Dr. Chua has been a lecturer in the Masters in Clinical Pharmacy Program Cardiovascular Module at the Chinese University of Hong Kong (2016) and is currently a Facilitator in the University Alberta, PharmD for Pharmacists Program. He is also a cardiology preceptor for UBC pharmacy undergraduate students (E2P program), graduate PharmD program, and Lower Mainland Pharmacy Services (LMPS) Hospital Pharmacy Residency Program.

He has won teaching awards from UBC and the LMPS Hospital Pharmacy Residency Program. Dr. Chua also teaches regularly in the UBC Faculty of Medicine Cardiology Fellow Academic Half Day.

Sheri L Koshman

BScPharm, PharmD, ACPR

Dr. Koshman is an Associate Professor of Medicine (Cardiology) at the University of Alberta. She practices in ambulatory cardiology, including the Cardiac EASE Clinic and the Heart Function Clinic at the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute. She also provides research support as a Research Advisor to pharmacy residents in the Alberta Pharmacy Residency Program.

She has been very involved with CSHP at both branch and national levels. She is the Past President of the Alberta Branch and sat on Alberta Branch Council in the roles of Branch Delegate and Education Chair. Key achievements included spearheading a student and provincial research committee. National contributions included membership on the Research Committee, including Chair, and membership on an SES Task Force. As Research Chair, key achievements included streamlining the abstracts and grant submission/evaluation process.

Dr. Koshman's clinical practice is full scope and includes performing full medical histories, physical examination, ordering laboratory tests, and independent prescribing. She was one of the first 15 pharmacists to be granted the ability to independently prescribe in Alberta. Her clinical practice has been highlighted in numerous publications as unique and advanced. She is a clinical expert in heart failure and currently sits on the primary panel for the Canadian Cardiovascular Society Heart Failure Guideline Committee. Provincially, she also sits on the Heart Failure Expert Working Group. She has developed an app (Med-HF) to help healthcare providers practically manage heart failure medications. These algorithms are used as support tools in heart failure clinics in Alberta.

Her research interests are in cardiovascular pharmacotherapy, including drug utilization and practice patterns, and in pharmacy practice, including prescribing and practice roles. She has won a number of awards for her research. She supports both residents and students in their research projects. In her role as Research Advisor, she co-developed a standardized provincial research program to support residents. The program includes structured didactic sessions and review and feedback of project deliverables throughout the year.

Dr. Koshman is involved at many levels of teaching: undergraduates (pharmacy, medicine), Doctor of Pharmacy students, and residents (pharmacy, medicine). She is also active in continuous professional learning for both pharmacists and physicians. Teaching activities include course development, lectures, seminars, facilitation, and clinical rotations. She has received Preceptor of the Year awards for her work with both residents and Doctor of Pharmacy students.

Michael Legal

BScPharm, PharmD, ACPR

Dr. Legal is a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist in Adult Internal Medicine at Providence Health Care (St. Paul's Hospital) in Vancouver, British Columbia. He is also a Clinical Associate Professor with the University of British Columbia, Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences.

He has served as a Presidential Officer with CSHP BC Branch from 2014-2016 and has been involved in several BC Branch committees over the years, including the Advocacy Committee, the Programs Committee, and the Certified Pharmacist Prescriber Task Force. He is currently a member of the CSHP Research Committee. Some notable achievements as Presidential Officer included meetings with the BC Health Minister and Opposition Health Critic to discuss expanded scope of pharmacy practice in BC, implementation of a physical assessment course for pharmacists, and the implementation of a branch advocacy committee to strengthen efforts around advocacy.

Dr. Legal has been actively involved at his practice site as a clinician, researcher, and interim clinical coordinator. He has also been the primary investigator on numerous research projects. Some career research highlights include the development, validation and implementation of a High Target Vancomycin dosing nomogram, and his work at the UBC Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences leading the AGILE Project (Advancing Experiential Learning in Institutional Pharmacy Practice). His UBC work involved implementing multiple initiatives and research projects to build capacity for experiential education at BC hospital sites. He has presented and published locally, nationally, and internationally on learner-preceptor models in experiential education and is currently collaborating with the University of Alberta, Office of Experiential Education, to complete three preceptor guidebooks on this topic.

Since early in his career, experiential education has been a major area of focus and excellence for Dr. Legal. He has precepted over 70 pharmacy residents, post graduate doctor of pharmacy students, and undergraduate students, and has been the recipient of multiple precepting and teaching awards. He has lectured for the UBC Post Graduate Doctor of Pharmacy Program, the UBC BSc Pharm program, and for the UBC Entry to Practice PharmD Program. He also teaches in the UBC undergraduate medical program.

Heather Neville

Heather Neville graduated from Dalhousie with a BSc in Pharmacy in 1990 and an MSc in 2006. She completed a Drug Use Policy and Management Residency with the Initiative on Medication Management, Policy Analysis, Research & Training (IMPART) at the College of Pharmacy at Dalhousie. She has been employed at the Queen Elizabeth II Health Sciences Centre in Halifax since 1990 as a clinical trials pharmacist, then as a drug utilization pharmacist since 1999. Currently she spends 50% of her time as a drug utilization pharmacist and the other 50%

as pharmacy research coordinator. As research coordinator, she facilitates research conducted by pharmacy staff by providing training, mentoring, and grant support. She maintains an active research program in the areas of pharmacy practice, medication adherence, drug utilization measurement, and pharmacoepidemiology.

Ms. Neville has authored or co-authored eighteen journal articles and over 45 abstracts. Two of her research projects have received CSHP Management and Leadership Best Practice Awards. Ms. Neville was awarded the Dalhousie College of Pharmacy Alumnus of the Year Award in 2016 for contributions to student education and mentorship in research. She has been actively involved in CSHP, serving as a CSHP Foundation Trustee from 2009-2015 and the Nova Scotia Branch President in 2015-2016.

Heather is mother to two beautiful daughters but is looking forward to an empty nest so that she can spend more time biking, hiking, kayaking, and playing pickleball.

Douglas James Sellinger

Douglas Sellinger is the Manager of Pharmacist Operations and Medication Safety at Saskatchewan Health Authority. In this position he manages the pharmacist knowledge required with the medication distribution system as well as the pharmacy informatics team and the pharmacists working in the long term care/rehabilitation hospital. His responsibilities also include the design and maintenance of a safe medication system in Regina and acting as residency preceptor for the elective informatics rotation.

Mr. Sellinger was the CSHP President from 2012-2013, and he has served as a member or chair of numerous branch and national committees. He chaired the Compounding Guidelines Knowledge Mobilization Taskforce and was a member of the Compounding Guidelines writing team. He is also an active PSN member and former chair of the Parenteral Services PSN.

Mr. Sellinger has been focused on pharmacy informatics for many years. Most recently, he was part of the team responsible for creating and maintaining the Saskatchewan Smart IV Pump Drug Library. Other informatics projects have included the implementation of automated dispensing cabinets, high-density storage retrieval robots, and a pharmacy bar code project. Current projects involve creating province-wide informatics systems.

Mr. Sellinger is a primary residency preceptor for pharmacy informatics and a secondary preceptor for pharmacy practice I rotation in Saskatchewan Health Authority. He has organized and presented on a series of webinars and in-person presentations for the CSHP Compounding Guidelines Knowledge Mobilization Taskforce, including a pre-PPC workshop in 2017.

Kathryn Timberlake

PharmD

Clinical Pharmacy Specialist with the Antimicrobial Stewardship Program (ASP) at The Hospital for Sick Children (SickKids) in Toronto.

Dr. Kathryn (Kat) Timberlake graduated with a PharmD from the University of Michigan in 2002. She then went on to complete a General Practice Residency at the University of California, San Francisco, the following year.

Dr. Timberlake started her career at The Hospital for Sick Children in 2003 as the Clinical Pharmacist in Cardiology. This position allowed her to develop a passion for pediatric patient care and to pursue interests in research and teaching. Through her work as the interim Therapeutic Drug Monitoring Coordinator, she developed an interest in infectious diseases. In 2010, she moved into a newly created position as the Antimicrobial Stewardship Pharmacist at the hospital, working in collaboration with the hospital's ASP physician and with other ASP pharmacists and physicians from across the city, country, and North America. Dr. Timberlake has sought to make an impact on the systems, and antibiotic prescribing at The Hospital for Sick Children and elsewhere through research and quality improvement projects. This position continues to foster her interest in research and teaching.

She has actively served on many committees throughout the past 14 years at The Hospital for Sick Children, including Residency Advisory Committee, Pharmacy Quality, and Medication Safety. She currently serves as Secretary of the Antimicrobial Advisory Group and Co-chair of the Antimicrobial Stewardship Steering Committee. She has been on the Research Ethics Board of the hospital since 2015.

As a preceptor and occasional lecturer in the Faculty of Pharmacy at the University of Toronto, she has precepted students and residents from all levels for experiential education. She lectures annually in several different courses to increase student exposure to pediatric content, with a focus on infectious diseases.

In order to give back to CSHP, she joined the Metro Toronto Chapter Planning Committee in 2006, and as an extension of that, joined the Educational Services Committee. In 2008, Dr. Timberlake became the Chair of the Metro Toronto Chapter, hosting annual Residency Nights and planning CE events. In 2007, she was nominated as Chair of the Paediatrics PSN, a position she held until 2012, which allowed her to connect with pediatric pharmacists from across the country.

Outside of pharmacy, Dr. Timberlake stays busy with her twins, Chloé and Félix, enjoys running, and living in downtown Toronto with all it has to offer.

What is the CSHP Fellows Program? Quel est l'objet du Programme des associés de la SCPH?

The CSHP Fellow program was initiated in 1948 to distinguish members who, through their practice activities and contributions to CSHP and the profession, were worthy of a recognition that signified outstanding leadership, dedication and commitment to practice excellence and professional growth.

Candidates for Fellow status are assessed in a peer review process after completing an application form which documents the member's achievements in several key criteria areas. In the first 50 years of the program, 186 members of CSHP have achieved the distinction of being recognized as a "Fellow of the Canadian Society of Hospital Pharmacists" (FCSHP).

Why is it important?

The Fellow program seeks to provide a stimulus and challenge for pharmacists practising in hospitals and other organized healthcare settings to raise standards of professional service, advance patient outcomes and promote the pharmacist's role as primary healthcare professionals.

The program recognizes the long-term, sustained involvement of pharmacists in leadership roles with CSHP and APES in areas that advance the goals of the profession. Furthermore, the program distinguishes those who have demonstrated sustained practice excellence and have implemented progressive pharmacy programs resulting in improved outcomes which have been translated into practice. Successful candidates must have contributed to pharmacy knowledge through publication, presentation, and research and have demonstrated ongoing commitment to educating health care practitioners, patients and the public.

Who should apply?

Members of CSHP and APES who meet the criteria are invited annually to apply. Potential candidates are encouraged to make an informed self-assessment prior to proceeding with their application. Candidates must have practiced pharmacy for at least ten years, of which a minimum of five must have been in an organized health care setting and be a Member of CSHP.

What are the benefits of being awarded CSHP Fellow status?

You will be recognized as a Member who serves as a model for others through exemplary practice. Your name will be listed as a Fellow on the CSHP website as well as future awards programs. Your name will also be added to the Fellows database of experts "Ask a Fellow/ Demandez à un associé" where you will have the opportunity to share your expertise as a mentor to other hospital pharmacists.
