Diane graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy from the College of Pharmacy, Dalhousie University, in 1978, and a Maîtrise en évaluation des technologies de la santé (Master of Science in Health Technology Assessment) from Université de Montréal in 2014. Most of her career has been spent in New Brunswick, where she worked as the Drug Information/Drug Use Evaluation Pharmacist at The Moncton Hospital and later as Regional Lead for HTA for Horizon Health Network. More recently, she was Clinical Pharmacy Specialist, Palliative Care, and she currently works with the

pharmacist team in the Dr. Sheldon H. Rubin Oncology Clinic at The Moncton Hospital.

Diane's involvement in pharmacy-related committees and organizations was a direct result of her attending an annual general meeting of the CSHP in Winnipeg back in the late 1980s. There, she discovered like-minded individuals who, regardless of their workplace, were faced with similar issues and who challenged her to participate in practice-changing action. It was the beginning of an amazing journey for which she will always be grateful.

Throughout her career, Diane has acted as a preceptor to pharmacy learners in both undergraduate and postgraduate programs and as an educator for her pharmacy peers, as well as nurses, physicians, and medical residents. She has been involved in numerous hospital committees and has chaired, among others, the Research Ethics Board, the Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee, and most recently the Regional Medically Assisted Dying Steering Committee.

Named a Fellow of the CSHP in 2015, Diane has held leadership positions at the Branch and National levels of the organization, including Branch President (two terms), delegate to the National Board, and Chair or member of various National and Branch committees and task forces. She has been active on many CSHP-related committees since 1991, and just recently stepped down from the Pharmacy Practice Publications Steering Committee. Diane is a past-president of the Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada, the New Brunswick Pharmaceutical Society (now the New Brunswick College of Pharmacists), and the National Association of Pharmacy Regulatory Authorities and is former chair of Health Canada's Expert Advisory Committee on the Vigilance of Health Products. She is a recipient of the Meritorious Service Award of the New Brunswick Pharmaceutical Society and the Gordon Kane Meritorious Service Award of the CSHP New Brunswick Branch.

Diane is winding down her career and, with retirement at hand, is shifting from work-related to leisure-related activities such as singing, reading, paddling a canoe, and trail hiking with her family's springer spaniel, Sasha. Laura V Minard
BSc, BSc(Pharm), PhD, ACPR

Laura completed a BSc (Honours) in biochemistry and molecular biology combined with psychology at Dalhousie University, followed by a PhD in biochemistry at the University of Alberta. She went on to pursue a BSc(Pharm) at the College of Pharmacy, Dalhousie University, and completed a hospital pharmacy residency at the QEII Health Sciences Centre. Following her residency, Laura worked in cardiology and cardiac surgery for one year before transitioning into her current role as a clinical pharmacist in medical oncology with the Nova Scotia

Health Authority (NSHA).

Laura is passionate about research. As part of the oncology team, she has precepted pharmacy residents and supervised their research studies with a goal of optimizing patient education about oncology medications and ultimately improving patient care. This research has won both local and national awards and has been published. Laura has been involved in other areas of research at NSHA, including a point prevalence study of benzodiazepine and sedative-hypnotic drug use at Nova Scotia hospitals and a qualitative analysis of pharmacists' perspectives on barriers and facilitators to implementing clinical pharmacy key performance indicators (cpKPIs). Laura also works as a research associate at Dalhousie's College of Pharmacy, where recent topics of her research have included opioid use by patients with cancer at the end of life, statin utilization by Nova Scotia seniors, and pharmacist prescribing.

Laura has worked as a Skills Lab Demonstrator at Dalhousie's College of Pharmacy and, as part of her NSHA role, has served as a preceptor for both undergraduate pharmacy students and pharmacy residents. She recently provided education about oral chemotherapy agents to pharmacy staff across Nova Scotia, with the goal of reducing medication errors upon hospital admission. Laura volunteers as the Senior Chair of the CSHP Nova Scotia Branch Membership Committee and as a member of the Research Committee of the Canadian Association of Pharmacy in Oncology. Laura is also a member of several committees within NSHA, such as the Pharmacy Research Committee, the Oncology Subtherapeutics Committee, the cpKPI Leadership Team, and the Patient Medication Safety Committee.

The New Hospital Pharmacy Practitioner Award is given to new hospital pharmacy practitioners who, through their service to patient care, to education or research, to the profession, and to CSHP, are deemed worthy of recognition. Recipients exhibit promising leadership, dedication, and commitment to practice excellence and professional growth.

Sydney Evans, a fourth-year pharmacy student at Memorial University of Newfoundland, is honoured to have been selected as this year's recipient of the CSHP Hospital Pharmacy Student Award. Sydney was born in Moncton and completed three years of undergraduate studies in the Faculty of Science at St. Francis Xavier University before she chose to pursue a degree and a career in pharmacy. She was drawn to the profession for its evolving scope of practice and the value that pharmacists bring to patient care.

Sydney feels fortunate to have gained exposure to many speciality areas of pharmacy practice. She has completed clinical rotations at The Moncton Hospital in the areas of cardiology, diabetes, geriatrics, neurology, and infectious disease. For the past three summers, Sydney worked as a pharmacy intern at The Moncton Hospital, through the Horizon Health Network Internship Program. During this time, Sydney conducted multiple quality improvement projects, including development of learning modules on medication reconciliation, a retrospective chart review to determine opioid prescribing patterns upon discharge, and a pain management survey.

As a pharmacy student, Sydney has been involved in various leadership and advocacy initiatives. Sydney is the financial representative for her graduation class and a member of the Memorial University Pharmacy Students. In these roles, she organizes activities to enhance the social and academic experience of her classmates. Sydney also volunteers with Special Olympics, coaching children and adults with physical and cognitive disabilities.

As the CSHP student representative for Memorial University, Sydney has been involved in promoting hospital pharmacy practice throughout her time in the pharmacy program. In this role, she promotes hospital pharmacy practice by planning hospital-inspired learning opportunities to increase students' awareness of hospital pharmacy. She is also a member of the CSHP Membership Recruitment and Retention working group, which is developing an action plan for contacting members whose memberships have lapsed.

Sydney is looking forward to becoming a practising pharmacist focused on patient-centred care and hopes to work in a hospital setting while incorporating research and teaching into her career.

Mitsuho (Mits) Miyata
B.Sc. (Pharm), ACPR, FCSHP
Honorary Membership CSHP

Mits Miyata graduated in 1981 from The University of British Columbia (UBC) with a Bachelor of Science (Pharmacy), and completed a hospital pharmacy residency in 1982. After a few weeks of relief work in the Northwest Territories, he joined the pharmacy team at St. Paul's Hospital, Vancouver, as a clinical pharmacist. In the ensuing years, he engaged in progressively more advanced leadership roles, first as a clinical team leader, then as a clinical supervisor and dispensary coordinator. During

this period, he became a key clinical resource on the topics of pharmacokinetics, HIV care, and injection drug use; was actively involved in the BC residency program and the UBC teaching program; and was a preceptor (internal medicine) during the inaugural years of the UBC Doctor of Pharmacy Program. In 2001, he accepted a role as a Regional Clinical Pharmacy Manager (and later as a Director) with the Fraser Health Authority, where he launched an innovative, large-scale pharmacist home visit program and integrated clinical pharmacists into key roles in community outpatient care.

Outside the work setting, Mits immersed himself in numerous activities on several fronts to help advance the pharmacy profession. During his 7 years on the Drug Benefit Council with the BC government's Ministry of Health, he contributed evidence-based advice about appropriate medications to be included in the provincial PharmaCare program. As Chair of the Board of Examiners of the College of Pharmacists of British Columbia, he facilitated the transition from panel exams to a more stringent Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) format. While serving on the Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada, he became deeply involved in the development of a national examination process that included an OSCE component, which in turn enabled mutual recognition of a pharmacist's qualifications across Canada, as facilitated by the National Association of Pharmacy Regulatory Authorities. During his time as Chair of the CSHP Advocacy Committee, Mits tirelessly pursued more effective ways to advocate the benefits of the profession, work that has led to strategies, tools, and processes that will help to facilitate advocacy efforts in public, health leadership, government, and interprofessional forums.

Mits's many achievements have been recognized through several prestigious awards at the local, provincial, and national levels, including the Fraser Health "Above and Beyond" Lifetime Achievement Award (2017) and the BC Health Care Gold Apple Award (2018). He is both honoured and deeply humbled to now be recognized by his peers as an Honorary Member of the CSHP.

CSHP Fellow status is conferred by the Fellows (FCSHF) Recognition Committee upon CSHP Members who have demonstrated noteworthy, sustained service and excellence in the practice of pharmacy in an organized healthcare setting.

Karen Dahri

BSc, BSc(Pharm), ACPR, PharmD

Karen is currently a Clinical Pharmacotherapeutic and Research Specialist with Vancouver General Hospital, Vancouver Coastal Health, and an Assistant Professor (Partner) with the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, The University of British Columbia (UBC).

During her tenure as the CSHP British Columbia Branch President, Karen strove to improve member benefits. Under her leadership, the Branch created a New Hospital Pharmacy Practitioner Award and Compassionate

Membership Grant, and access to continuing education events was extended to all members in the province through recording and podcasting. Rx News Flash, a series of short, rapid-response, web-based segments giving expert opinion on ground-breaking literature and its applicability to practice, was also created. She secured the first meeting of the Branch with the provincial minister of health to advocate for the profession. Preliminary work on a physical assessment course for pharmacists also began during her presidency.

Karen has focused much of her professional attention on improving the care of high-risk elderly patients through a variety of interventions, such as comprehensive pharmacist review of medications and communication with community care providers. She has been interested in improving the care of patients with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease through better education and optimization of medications. She has implemented and evaluated novel curriculum changes in her teaching at the university and has led a pilot of a novel modular curriculum design in the previous Bachelor of Science (Pharmacy) program at UBC. This ultimately served as the template for the future medication management modules in the Entry-to-Practice Doctor of Pharmacy (E2P PharmD) degree.

Teaching has always been a great source of professional satisfaction for Karen. She has taught many levels of learners, both in the classroom and as a preceptor during clinical rotations. She is the current lead for the Respiratory Module, a 100-hour module taught in the second year of the E2P PharmD degree at UBC, and is also the developer and course coordinator for a new elective focusing on the management of hospitalized patients in acute care settings.

What is the CSHP Fellow Program?

Quel est l'objet du Programme des associés de la SCPH?

The CSHP Fellow program was initiated in 1948 to distinguish members who, through their practice activities and contributions to CSHP and the profession, were worthy of a recognition that signified outstanding leadership, dedication and commitment to practice excellence and professional growth.

Candidates for Fellow status are assessed in a peer review process after completing an application form which documents the member's achievements in several key criteria areas. To date, 187 members of CSHP have achieved the distinction of being recognized as a "Fellow of the Canadian Society of Hospital Pharmacists" (FCSHP).

Why is it important?

The Fellow program seeks to provide a stimulus and challenge for pharmacists practising in hospitals and other organized healthcare settings to raise standards of professional service, advance patient outcomes and promote the pharmacist's role as primary healthcare professionals.

The program recognizes the long-term, sustained involvement of pharmacists in leadership roles with CSHP and A.P.E.S. (Association des pharmaciens des établissements de santé du Québec) in areas that advance the goals of the profession. Furthermore, the program distinguishes those who have demonstrated sustained practice excellence and have implemented progressive pharmacy programs resulting in improved outcomes which have been translated into practice. Successful candidates must have contributed to pharmacy knowledge through publication, presentation, and research and have demonstrated ongoing commitment to educating health care practitioners, patients and the public.

Who should apply?

Members of CSHP and A.P.E.S. who meet the criteria are invited annually to apply. Potential candidates are encouraged to make an informed self-assessment prior to proceeding with their application. Candidates must have practiced pharmacy for at least ten years, of which a minimum of five must have been in an organized health care setting and be a Member of CSHP.

What are the benefits of being awarded CSHP Fellow status?

You will be recognized as a Member who serves as a model for others through exemplary practice. Your name will be listed as a Fellow on the CSHP website as well as future awards programs. Your name will also be added to the Fellows database of experts "Ask a Fellow/ Demandez à un associé" where you will have the opportunity to share your expertise as a mentor to other hospital pharmacists.

Patient Care Enhancement Award

Benzodiazepine and Sedative-Hypnotic Drug Use in Nova Scotia Hospitals: A Point Prevalence Survey (completed at Nova Scotia Health Authority)
